For my PhD (ESRC Studentship), I worked on the relationship between education politicians and civil servants, 1970-1074. Using Weber's ideal type constructions of authority, I argued that civil servants used more rational legal authority in education policy-making processes, while politicians used more traditional, not charismatic authority in education policy-making processes.

I continue to work on multiculturalism and citizenship in Education, having given invited papers in the UK, Turkey and Australia (2011-2013) but I am currently working on integration and education policy-making and looking to see how integrationist terminology has shaped and influenced both education and social policy-making processes in England with global applications.
